Welcome & Introductions	Chairman welcomed all to the meeting, she also welcomed Jane Royal and 2 members of the community. As Jane Royle is new in post a round the table introduction took place. Chairman thanked Jane Royle for the Cornwall & IOS health and wellbeing strategy, launch was on Tuesday 20 th this week. PCT are very pleased with it. William Thomas added that the document will add weight to the LPI's in the LAA	

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1 LAA	<p>LSP went through the LAA with these comments:</p> <p>NI110 young people participation, “TellUs” survey. In the last 2 years we have had a fantastic response from our children,</p> <p>NI72- NI 98 Educational targets NI72 and NI92 are national targets that we don’t have to have but we have chosen to have them. Every one in education are happy that these targets are stretching</p> <p>LPI 1 Local performance indicators are good for us, huge amount of work being done already, brings the school and housing in to the process</p> <p>LPI 2 develop a frame work for young people - A huge sense that came out in Sustainable Community Strategy and Children and Young Peoples Plan was that post 16 children are still apprehensive about what happens post local schooling, as the mainland is very different from the islands, Aisling Hick noted that even though they are in Cornwall, they are still our children, lots of good things have been done, but more to be done, 7 children have returned to the islands in the last 2 years. Chairman noted that this LPI is very important to us, cllr Bennett said that one of the partners should be PCT (mental health, dentist,) Aisling Hick asked Jane Royle if she was happy for the PCT to be a partner in this LPI, Jane Royle agreed to be signed up, it was mentioned that Alison Cook from the PCT is a member of the children’s and young peoples partnership.</p> <p>William Thomas asked if we could identify who was the lead partner in each PI, Aisling Hick agreed with William Thomas.</p> <p>LPI Place survey, There is a need to make sure that this survey is realistic to the island, we need to check on what is appropriate to our community (anti-social behaviour) We will have a lateral approach to this and it will tie into some of the things we do with children’s services</p> <p>NI155 affordable homes, base line of 5 going up 1 each year, based on the last few years we will over meet these targets. This came to full council last week, some members are worried that this is too high targets due to environment and infrastructure restraints this is coming to the Planning and Development Committee. The Authority are currently having difficulties with the housing corporation in sourcing funding to progress our current schemes. Because this indicator is in the LAA it gives us leverage to talk to other people about funding.</p>	<p>Identify each lead partner for each NI or LPI</p> <p>2</p>

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AOB	<p>NI 168 and 169 we have managed to get the department of transport to allow us to do our own thing, we managed to get an extraordinary grant for the the off island quays and are hoping that we can get this again for the roads of the islands. Colin Sturmer said that he had already carried out road survey and will talk to Aisling</p> <p>NI 191- waste minimisation, very keen to develop, lots of opportunities for waste management, again this has been put in so we have leverage to talk to DEFRA for funding in the future. Aisling Hick added that the authority is writing a waste strategy at the moment funded by DEFRA, this could include some cunning ideas on how we recycle.</p> <p>To close the LAA discussion Aisling Hick summarised that there are minor changes to be made with regards to elder care, she and Christine Gravestock will discuss to iron out any issues Every one agreed that they are happy to be partners where their names appear William Thomas wanted to change the name from Devon and Cornwall Authority to Devon and Cornwall Constabulary,</p> <p>LSP funding for Police and Teens</p> <p>Sgt Ashley Putman reported that there were 20 (14 yr) olds involved in this project, the children are evaluating the days each day and they are scoring very high, this was partly funded by the LSP to the value of £600, this project has been based around the care of lost people, drugs and safety awareness, on Friday they will do a live exercise, will be presented with certificates. Chairman asked how this could get back to the community; Tess Lloyd suggested that a page long article go in to the next edition of the lighthouse.</p> <p>Sgt Ashley Putman requested a second grant, this grant would be used by the local football club, and there are 90+ members at present. The project is for Plymouth Argyle football club to visit the islands for a 2 day scheme. Cost at the moment is £2k .Ashley said that the children will fund some of this project by way of a passport scheme, but he was asking for £500 contribution for the LSP to allow this to go ahead.</p> <p>The partnership has agreed to give £500 to put towards the football scheme.</p> <p>Arts for health – is a Cornwall based group, will set up art’s in its broadest sense. Christine Gravestock has talked to these people and she would need funding to help with the transport costs. The Chairman asked if every one agreed to this in principal and asked Christine Gravestock to come to another meeting with costing</p>	<p>Aisling to talk to Colin Sturmer with regards to road survey</p> <p>Change name from Devon and Cornwall Authority to Devon and Cornwall Constabulary</p> <p>Page long article to appear in the Lighthouse in Summer edition</p> <p>£500 to be awarded to this project Christine Gravestock to bring costing of this project to the next meeting</p>
