

## **Requirements for Notices for a Minor Variation**

For applications for Minor Variations to licences, the notice is to be displayed on the premises for a period of no less than 10 working days starting on the day after the day on which the application was given to the relevant licensing authority, by displaying a notice, in all cases, prominently at or on the premises to which the application relates where it can be conveniently read from the exterior of the premises and in the case of a premises covering an area of more than fifty metres square, a further notice in the same form and subject to the same requirements every fifty metres along the external perimeter of the premises abutting any highway;

The Notice to be displayed at the premises must be: of a size equal or larger than A4, on white paper, printed legibly in black ink or typed in black. The heading should be in a font of a size equal to or larger than 32, the rest of the notice should be in font size equal to or larger than 16; (The example shown is the correct font sizes)

N.B the Date of this Notice must be the day after the application for the licence was correctly given to the Licensing Authority

# Licensing Act 2003: Minor Variation of Premises Licence<sub>1</sub>

Applications for a Minor Variation to the Premises Licence for *The Pub, 1 Main Street, Village, Isles of Scilly TR21*

The variation, if granted is to enable the following changes to take place: *(give brief details of variation to include details of the times for the changed activities)*.

Any person wishing to make representations in relation to this application may do so by writing to the Licensing Department, Council of the Isles of Scilly, Town Hall, St Mary's Isles of Scilly TR21 0LW

Objection may be made for 10 working days from the date of this notice.

A Copy of the application for the minor variation to the above licence is kept by Licensing Department, Council of the Isles of Scilly, Town Hall, St Mary's Isles of Scilly TR21 0LW. The application can be view Monday to Thursday 9am to 5pm and 9am to 4.30pm on Fridays, except bank holidays.

It is an offence knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with an application the maximum fine for which a person is liable on summary conviction for making a false statement is a Level 5 fine on the standard scale.
