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CONDITIONS

- 1. The term 'public highway' includes the road and adjacent pavements.
- 2. Suitable and sufficient warning signs are to be erected in advance of and at the site.
- 3. Scaffolding and hoarding must be properly lit at night.
- 4. Scaffolding and hoarding must be erected by persons properly trained.
- 5. Scaffolding/hoarding must be erected in accordance with the guidance notes issued by the Health & Safety executive. Copies are available from the Town Hall.
- 6. Access ladders must be removed or made inaccessible to the public at the end of each working day.
- 7. Proper measures must be taken to prevent articles falling onto the footpath.
- 8. Where the footpath is obstructed a properly guarded walkway must be provided around the scaffolding/hoarding.
- 9. Site preparation, scaffold/hoarding erection, use and dismantling must be in compliance with all legislative standards and procedures as required by the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and other relevant Regulations. (Employers and self employed are reminded of their duty to undertake their activities with due regard to the Health, Safety and Welfare of themselves, their employees and all others who may be affected by their undertakings).
- 10. The applicant must make formal contact with the following agencies to ensure the work does not impede their access. Isles of Scilly Council Planning Department, Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Service, H M Coastguard, Road Carrier Services. Evidence of this must be sent to the Infrastructure department. Where this agreement cannot be reached the Council will assist to find a solution but will be under no obligation to provide alternative arrangements.
- 11. An inspection report is kept by the applicant or the principal contractor.
- 12. This permission shall be operative for a specified period and at the end of that period the scaffolding and hoarding shall be removed from the Highway and the site thereof left in a clean and tidy condition and any damage to the Highway repaired to the satisfaction of the Senior Manager for Infrastructure & Planning or their representative.
- 13. Reportable incidents or accidents required under the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1995 (RIDDOR) are notified to the Council or Health and Safety Executive without delay.
