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CONDITIONS

- 1. The term 'public highway' includes the road and adjacent pavements.
- 2. Suitable and sufficient warning signs are to be erected in advance of and at the site.
- 3. Any articles placed on the skip must not overhang the sides of the skip so as to cause danger to pedestrians, cyclists or vehicles.
- 4. The skip is to be properly lit at night.
- 5. The granting of permission does not exempt the applicant or his/her contractor from complying with statutory requirements e.g. Road Traffic Act, Health and Safety at Work Act.
- 6. The applicant must make formal contact with the following agencies to ensure the work does not impede their access, a copy of which must be sent to the infrastructure department. Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Service, H M Coastguard, Road Carrier Services and Waste Management Service. Where this agreement cannot be reached the Council will assist to find a solution but will be under no obligation to provide alternative arrangements.
- 7. This permission shall be operative for a specified period and at the end of that period the skip shall be removed from the Highway and the site thereof left in a clean and tidy condition and any damage to the Highway repaired to the satisfaction of the Senior Manager for Infrastructure & Planning or their representative.
- 8. Reportable incidents or accidents required under the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1995 (RIDDOR) are notified to the Council or Health an Safety Executive without delay.
