Housing crisis - can you help?

The shortage of housing on the Isles of Scilly has reached a point where Councillors have voted unanimously to declare a housing crisis in order to raise awareness of the issue. This letter is to ask for your help with our immediate need to find homes.

We want to hear from anyone who has a private residential rental available for medium or long term use or a property they are willing to change from a holiday let to residential use. We are interested in accommodation of any size, including houses, flats and even spare rooms. At the time of writing, there are 15 households on our homeless list and many more that we know are at risk of becoming homeless because, for example, their winter let accommodation returns to holiday use at the start of the visitor season. The sustainability of the islands depends on the availability of homes for those working here. With each person forced to leave the islands, we run a risk that important services may be disrupted.

Help if you're homeless or about to become homeless

In England, your council must help if you are legally homeless or will become homeless within the next 8 weeks. What is the Council doing about the crisis?

As a response to the critical need for housing, the council has acquired a property in Hugh Town, 'April Cottage', to convert into 3 dwellings expected to be completed by the end of March 2022. We are also meeting with other large employers that have a presence on the islands to discuss how we might work together to improve the situation. These actions sit alongside our longer term aim to enable up to 23 new build homes at the site of the old secondary school at Carn Thomas and 12 self build homes in Old Town.
