I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great Imperial family to which we all belong, but I shall not have the strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in with me, as I now invite you to do. I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it.'

Sentences, Introduction and Prayer Canon Perran Gay, Chaplain to the Isles

The officiant reads the following sentences of Scripture

Jesus said, I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die.

I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The officiant greets the people

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you

All and also with you.

The officiant adds further words of welcome and introduction and then invites the congregation to **stand**.

Opening Prayer

We meet this day to remember before God our late Sovereign Lady QUEEN ELIZABETH, to renew our trust and confidence in Christ, and to pray that together we may be one in him, through whom we offer our prayers and praises to the Father. Let us be still for a moment and remember God's presence with us now.

All keep a moment of silent reflection, at the end of which the Officiant says the Opening Prayer

Blessed are you, Lord our God, lover of souls: you uphold us in life and sustain us in death: to you be glory and praise for ever!

For the darkness of this age is passing away as Christ the bright morning star brings to his saints the light of life. As you give light to those in darkness, and all who walk in the shadow of death, so remember in your kingdom your faithful servant, ELIZABETH, that death may be for her the gate to life and to unending fellowship with you; where with your saints you live and reign, one in the perfect union of love, now and for ever.

All sing the following hymn (known to be one of The Queen's favourites)

Almighty God, Father of all mercies and giver of all comfort: deal graciously, we pray, with all who mourn, the members of the Royal Family, this Nation and all the Nations of the Commonwealth, that casting all our care on you, we may know the consolation of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

And let us offer to God our prayers for ourselves and one another, for grace to follow the Queen's example of Christian service, and to share with her in the joys of the world to come.

Bring us, O Lord God, at our last awakening into the house and gate of heaven, to enter into that gate and dwell in that house, where there shall be no darkness nor dazzling, but one equal light; no noise nor silence, but one equal music; no fears nor hopes, but one equal possession; no ends nor beginnings, but one equal eternity; in the habitations of your glory and dominion, world without end.

May we all go forward together on that day to meet Christ, when he, our life, appears in glory.

Direct all his endeavours to your glory, and the welfare of his people; and give us grace to honour and obey him for conscience sake; that he may always possess the hearts of his people, that his reign may be long and prosperous, and that you will crown him with immortality in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
