"In terms of style then a building reflecting other buildings on St Martins, of a similar scale is not likely to generate a particular issue, ideally a supporting statement is provided that sets out what the building is for, the scale of the building, any design references to reflect the character of the St Martins part of the loS Conservation Area, whether it would be considered appropriate in terms of the seascape/landscape of the AONB. It will be important to set out any biodiversity enhancements you would seek to deliver (bat boxes, bird boxes appropriate to species found locally) and any waste management arrangement associated with construction and use and any sustainable design features you intend to incorporate. Providing there is a justification for the erection of the building, to meet the economic and long-term sustainable needs of St Martins, and it is of a design and scale appropriate to the site, then there should be no objection to the proposal."
