



## **National Severe Weather Warning Service**





## **Chief Forecasters Assessment**

Very strong winds are forecast to affect western parts of the UK during Monday. Southerly winds are most likely to gust between 50 and 60 mph across much of the warning area with perhaps gusts of 70 to 80 mph in more exposed parts. These strong winds are forecast in association with the northward track of ex-Ophelia across or near to the west of the British Isles.

Heavy rain is also possible in association with this system with northwestern UK most prone at this stage.

The Met Office have issued a Yellow Warning of Wind

Valid from 08:00 on Mon, 16th Oct 2017 until 23:55 on Mon, 16th Oct 2017

A spell of very windy weather is likely on Monday in association with ex-Ophelia.

Some delays to road, rail, air and ferry transport are possible. There is a slight chance that power cuts may occur, with the potential to affect other services, such as mobile phone coverage. There is a slight chance of some damage to buildings, such as tiles from roofs. It is possible that some coastal routes, sea fronts and coastal communities will be affected by spray and/or large waves. There is also a small chance that injuries could occur from beach material being thrown onto sea fronts.
