As an addition to our letter of the 3rd Nov regarding the subject application, we would like to make the following points:

Our Comments disputing the contention by the applicant of continued legal use of Pendrathen quarry.

For the period 2005 -2012, the invoices presented by the applicant appear to cover work outside the quarry and do not prove the continual use of the quarry per the current application. Nothing disputes the McFarlands Downs residents' Statement made previously.

The CTO's statement of 20/09/12 in a Council meeting to the General Policy & Resources Committee appears to indicate that the recycled material for building projects has been sourced from Moorwell recycling initiatives - no mention of Pendrathen.

Comments concerning the lawful use of the quarry.

There is documentary evidence backing up visual evidence that the quarry has been used for the storage of tarmac arisings dumped from 2012 in uncontained heaps in breach of the EA licence.

Also that there is uncontained dumping of asbestos contaminated waste from the Moorwell dump, again in breach of licence.

Both illegal activities to our knowledge and also in breach of the Quarry operator's agreement with the Duchy per our correspondence with the latter as of May 2013.

Both not mentioned in the extension for continued legal use sought in this application.
