Description of site and development:

This is a notification of an intention to carry out tree pruning works to one Scots Pine Tree located within the Isles of Scilly Conservation Area. Specifically the mature tree is located within the grounds of the property known as Sunwood on High Lanes to the north of Old Town.

The tree is located on the west side of the property close to the boundary with Hanover Court. It is a tall tree with a raised canopy that has a slight lean to the east. The tree is growing in close proximity to a telegraph pole and is therefore close to overhead cables. The applicant is intending to remove some of the long branches which overhand the driveway and the powerlines.

Conservation Area, AONB and Heritage Coast

Appraisal/key issues and conclusion:

A Scots Pine Tree is a native British evergreen tree and is relatively common on the island of St Mary's. The tree in question is a large specimen growing in the garden of a detached house. The works are proposed to remove overhanging branches from the driveway and to remove interference with power lines.

The tree holds good amenity value in the immediate vicinity and it is considered that the level of pruning works, to remove the unbalanced over-hanging branches would not result in a significant loss of amenity value. The proposed works are therefore acceptable.

Recommendation:

Raise no objections subject to the works being undertaken in accordance with the British Standards for Tree works.
