As visitors to Bryher over the last 30 years, and in recent years having stayed at all three of Atlanta, Glenhope and Glenhope High cottages, we were concerned to see that the planning application above allows for a significantly increased elevation to Bank Cottage on the other side of the narrow 'road' on which the cottages are situated. This increase in height would obviously affect the amount of daylight coming into the ground floor kitchen and the bedroom above it in Atlanta. The cottages, of course, have small windows and every bit of light is important!

The plans for the two buildings in the garden of Bank Cottage, are also cause for concern, as they would be more substantial than those already in existence and would affect the exceptionally beautiful (and highly valued) views from both Glenhope and Glenhope High.

While we understand that the new owners will want to carry out improvements to Bank Cottage, we feel that it is vital that the overall dimensions of the property are not increased to the detriment of not only the people living/staying in the cottages across the road from it, but also of all residents and visitors who find such joy in the beauty of this very special part of Bryher.
