Hello,

I am writing in objection to the recent planning application for a 4 port charging point for electric vehicles at the Buzza St site.

The application itself seems extremely vague and lacking in consideration, especially at this time of national and local uncertainty.

Guests and residents of the islands regularly use that path way. If it were blocked it would surely increase traffic - foot and car- across the petrol forecourt.

There don't appear to be any measurements or 3rd party risk assessments included in the plan, making it difficult to understand or comment. Should there be reports or risk assessments from; WPD (who must require reasonable access to the substation as a few years ago they had to run the generator from that space); the local petrol station (which seems incredibly close on the picture plan but there are no measurements); or a Fire Officer ( I understand they offer free fire advice to individuals and businesses)?

My final concern is that, at this point in the current crisis, is this sort of plan not a little insensitive and non-essential? The whole islands - one could argue- could be looking at financial ruin, and yet our local Council, are applying to our local Council, to install something presently lacking in demand, right on the doorstep of a local family run and absolutely essential business.

If it is the case as I suspect, that we must 'use it or lose it' with the funding, then maybe another less controversial and impartial site could be found for the first of what is going / hoped to be a large project.

Under current restrictions, is it reasonable or viable that the plan would be achieved by the end of 2020? If not, is it wise to even consult on it? There is no reference to who would carry out the work of installation, however one would imagine it's a specialist trade and mainland engineers would be required.
