Site 3, Police Station

Listed Buildings

The Outer Walls and Gateway are structures that form part of a wider Scheduled Ancient Monument relating to the Garrison and are Grade 1 listed. The nature of the proposals means that they will not be seen in the same context as the outer walls and gateway and will therefore have no impact on their special architectural or historical interest or setting.

There are no other listed building on the stretch of Jerusalem Terrace where the proposed site is located.

Scheduled Monument

Post-medieval breastwork, curtain wall and associated defensive structures on the periphery of The Garrison are all part of this scheduled monument in the vicinity of the proposed site. However, the nature of the proposals mean that they will not be seen in the same context as the outer walls and gateway and will therefore have no impact on their special architectural or historical interest or setting.

Non-designated Heritage Assets

There are three sites identified on the Cornwall & Isles of Scilly Heritage Environment Record in the immediate vicinity of the site that are neither Listed or Scheduled. These are MOUNT HOLLIS - Medieval fort, MOUNT HOLLES - Romano British shrine and HUGH TOWN - Early Medieval findspot. The proposals would not affect these sites as they are all approximately 50m away from the proposed site. There are no sites listed on the proposed charger location itself.
