### **Land adjacent to waste site, the quay, St Agnes.**

I write in support of this application.

This site at the top of the quay has always been available and intended for vehicle parking. When the quay was repaired and extended by the Duchy, this area at the top of the quay was cleared and a hedge planted by the Islanders to provide visual screening, and improve the visual aspect of a working area.

It is the ideal location on St Agnes for an electric vehicle charging point. The screening hedge is sufficiently substantial to hide the proposed canopy from view from public areas, and for anyone arriving on the quay.

Currently the use of this area for parking is inhibited by electrical waste awaiting shipment to St Mary's, which should be removed.
