Site Description and Proposed Development

Bryher Shop is an existing relatively modern development that provides the island of Bryher with a small retail outlet and the owners with accommodation. This is limited is size to a 2 bedroom attached dwelling.

The building is two storey with an area of garden and domestic landscaping to the front, used by customers and to the north side, for the parking of vehicles and for deliveries. To the east is a strip of land, that the applicants have acquired and have been using as domestic garden. Within this area of land they have placed a summer house.

The proposal is to retain the changed use of land as domestic garden, retain the summer house and erect a storage shed within the area to the front used for parking and deliveries.

The style of the summer house is a simple timber design with a lean-to roof and glazed doors facing south and a side facing window on the east elevation. The position is at the north side of the garden. Measuring 4m x 3m with an overall height of 2.4m at its highest point and 2.1m at the rear. The proposed shed is a similarly simple timber design measuring with a lean to roof, partially open on the side for a log store and a door and a window providing external storage for cardboard. The storage shed is slightly lower at the rear at 1.85m and higher at the front up to 2.11m. The proposed location of the shed is to the west side (front garden) behind the front boundary which is adjacent to the road. There is a pittosporum hedge to the western and southern boundaries around the drive way where the shed is to be sited.

 - Plan 3 Proposed Shed and Summer House Floor Plans, Date Stamped, Date Stamped 04/03/2022
 - Plan 4 Proposed Shed Elevations, Date Stamped 04/03/2022
 - Plan 5 Summer House Elevations, Date Stamped 15/02/2022
 - Design and Access Statement (Waste Management)

These are stamped as APPROVED

Reason: For the clarity and avoidance of doubt and in the interests of the character and appearance of the Conservation Area, Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and Heritage Coast in accordance with Policy OE1 and OE7 of the Isles of Scilly Local Plan (2015-2030).

C3 The summer house, hereby permitted, shall not be used or occupied at any time other than for purposes ancillary and incidental to the residential use of the dwelling within the property known as Bryher Shop and shall not be used for any other purpose.

Reason: The creation of any separate residential or commercial use within the summerhouse would require further assessment.

- C4 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015 (As Amended), (or any order revoking or reenacting that Order) prior to installation, details of any external lighting shall be submitted to and approved, in writing, by the Local Planning Authority. The lighting shall thereafter be installed in accordance with the agreed details.

 Reason: To protect the amenities of the locality, including the amenities of neighbouring residential properties and to protect the amenities of this rural area and preserve the dark
 - Reason: To protect the amenities of the locality, including the amenities of neighbouring residential properties and to protect the amenities of this rural area and preserve the dark night skies of the Isles of Scilly and the Bryher Dark Sky Discovery Site (Milky Way Class) in accordance with Policy OE4 of the Isles of Scilly Local Plan (2015-2030).
- All works involving machinery required in connection with the implementation of this permission shall be restricted to between 0800 and 1800 hours Monday to Saturdays. There shall be no works involving machinery on a Sunday or Public or Bank Holiday.

Reason: In the interests of protecting the residential amenities of the islands.
