## Dear sir,

I am writing to object to the planning application P/22/056/COU for change of use of Holgates Green.

As this is contrary to the councils policy of having the site for local events by filling it with vans this will restrict the use of the green by the public, both locals and visitors. As this is one of only two green sites in the town, in granting planning permission this will be a backward step and not progressive.

It would seem that the council is hell bent from removing all food vans from the back of the town hall, this planning application is obviously the thin end of the wedge. Once one is granted it sets a precedent and there will be a flood. For example on Friday 2nd September 2022 two barbecues were set up on the green behind the wall creating a lot of food odour and smoke and noise from the attendees.
