I am writing to support your plan to start a mobile food outlet on St Agnes and am happy for you to forward this to the Duchy, Council and any other interested party.

St Agnes has been in need of investment in catering establishments for several years. Last year in particular, with the closure of High Tide and the closed nights at the Turks Head, visitors (and locals) were regularly disappointed by the lack of choice for eating out.

I am confident an extra outlet would not take from the demand at the remaining outlets but enhance the offer the island has as a whole.

Eating options are particularly important for visitors staying on our campsite and I am confident you would have strong demand from them, as well as other self-catering visitors on St Agnes and day trippers.

Setting up a business in these economically challenging times is difficult anywhere, but you should not underestimate the challenges of doing so in our unique location. We will gratefully support your attempts to establish such a business and are confident the rest of the island residents and visitors will do likewise.

To be sustainable and successful in the long run I suggest a very careful approach to the overheads you take on. If you wish to locate at Troytown there would be no rent, and I hope any other venues will take a similarly long-term view in supporting a unique, brave and much needed new venture.
