My previous comments on flood risk (see attached) have hopefully been recorded already?

I note that the proposed method for managing on-site stormwater is a raised garden bed and water butt if a water soakaway is not feasible.

However, the daily maximum rainfall event expected in summer is 81 mm. The volume of water generated from the approx. 80 m<sup>2</sup> roof area will provide 6,400 litres of runoff. During heavy rainfall when the groundwater level under the property is high, internal drainage to ground may not cope with the volume of water from the roof as well as internal drainage in the garden. A water butt to deal with this volume of water would occupy a large proportion of the garden space available. (For comparison, a '44 gallon drum' water butt holds about 200 litres of water.)

Mention is made in 4.2.2 of the flood risk assessment of 'existing drainage provision on site'. It would be useful to ask the applicant to confirm that the existing stormwater drainage on site has the capacity to cope with the volume of stormwater expected to be generated during the design storm. If they do, the water butt and rain garden augment this capacity, rather than being required because the additional water generated is in excess of the current capacity for stormwater drainage.
