As requested by Bridget (I think) I took a quick look at this elm tree outside Tamarisk whilst I was visiting the IofS last week. It is a wonderful tree but is getting rather large and spreading which does pose some threat to the surrounding properties and also the people going back and forth. I think some sensitive crown reduction would be prudent, something that no doubt Ned Rogers could undertake. I would think a little work on a more regular basis would be better than risking a significant pollarding exercise, given the importance of the tree. It reminds me of a large ancient sycamore at Dumfries House where we have been doing some sensitive reduction work every couple of years, allowing for some periods of recovery in between.

Twiga, you mentioned that you were planning this anyway but it will have to wait until the autumn due to bird nesting season and presumably when Tamarisk is quieter.
